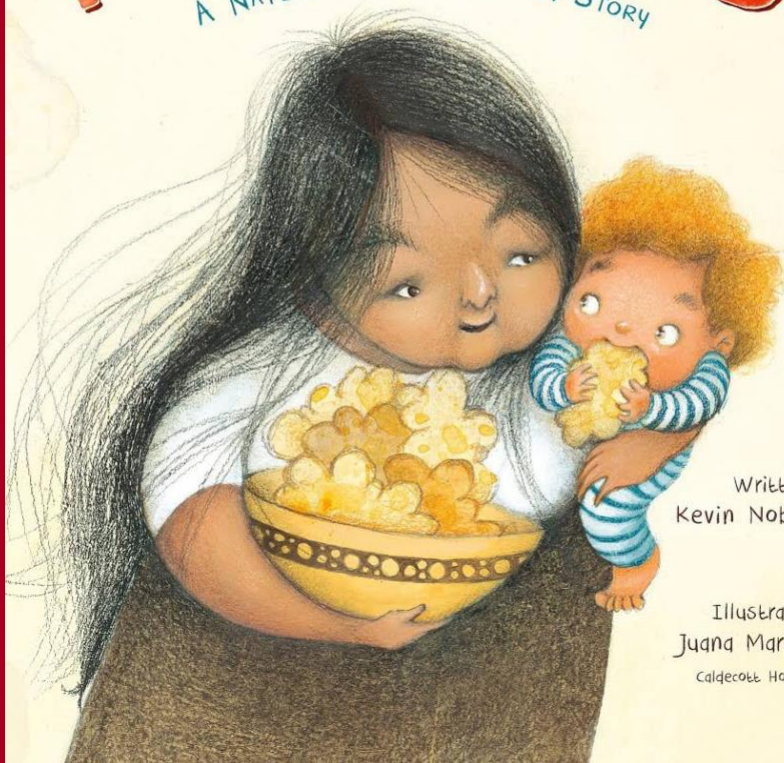

## About *Fry Bread: A Native American Family Story*

Told in a lively and powerful verse by author Kevin Noble Maillard, *Fry Bread: A Native American Family Story*, is an evocative depiction of a modern Native American family, vibrantly illustrated by Pura Belpre Award-winner and Caldecott Honoree Juana Martinez-Neal.

Kevin Maillard is Professor of Law at Syracuse University and a contributor to the *New York Times*. He has written articles for *The Atlantic*, *The Week*, *Essence*, and has appeared on MSNBC, ABC News, and NPR. Maillard received his B.A. in public policy from Duke University, his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania Law School, and his Ph.D. in political science from the University of Michigan.

Originally from Oklahoma, he is a member of the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma, Mekusukey Band. When he was thirteen years old, he won a fishing derby for catching seventy-two fish in two hours.

Maillard will be in Oklahoma and available for media appearances Thursday, October 24 and Friday, October 25 in advance of his appearance at the Wewoka Sorghum Festival. He will perform a reading from the book *Fry Bread* at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, Oct. 26 at the Seminole Nation Museum. A book-signing will follow. Maillard will also entertain the crowd by cooking his mother's Seminole fry bread recipe in the traditional manner over an open fire on the grounds of the museum.
